- Kathy Harper was the co-editor for a recently released special volume of the online collection, *Getting Started in Physics Education Research*, entitled "Research Traditions in Physics Education Research." The authors of this volume were invited by the larger community to write papers addressing some combination of how they conceptualize the field, how they describe their work within the field, how these views have changed during their careers, and what factors have influenced these changes. The result was a diverse set of articles that give insight into how one's research ideas and identity change after leaving graduate school. - Ohio State recognizes the importance of supporting postdoctoral researchers as they balance career, personal and family life. To provide greater equity amongst Ohio State faculty and staff, the Paid Leave Programs policy has been revised on an interim basis, including changes to parental leave eligibility and vacation accrual for postdoctoral researchers. - Ohio State's Department of Public Safety is now offering a new, free safety app for students, faculty and staff. [Rave Guardian](#) offers many benefits, including faster delivery of Buckeye Alerts and safety notices via push notifications. Like the Ohio State app, safety notices can be received within seconds when push notifications are turned on. You also can select friends or family as a virtual guardian to follow you via GPS tracking as you travel on and around campus. The virtual guardian is shown a timer based on your destination. If time expires, your virtual guardian will be alerted and encouraged to make appropriate follow-up. The app is available to download for

all students, faculty and staff signed up for [Buckeye Alerts](#). Download today by searching for "Rave Guardian" inside the [Ohio State app](#).

- Over the summer, ODEE staff implemented several changes to improve security for classroom pool computers. These include:
 - o Weekly classroom maintenance routines include visual inspections of all USB ports, inside and outside the podiums
 - o Tools that block users from installing software (including malicious software) that require administrative rights on pool classroom computers
 - o Adding faceplates to podiums to limit individuals from reaching inside the podium to place a USB keylogger
 - o The final change they will be implementing will occur on Thursday, October 11th. At this time, Carmen and Vita will be placed behind BuckeyePass multifactor authentication.
